HOME TREATMENT


- Apply a heat source to help it drain & heal fastersuch as a clean warm cloth
- Keep it clean
- DO NOT ATTEMPT TO CUT THE ABSCESS
- Let it drain naturally & don't squeeze it

WHEN TO SEEK HELP

If you have a fever, or the abscess has red streaking around it, over 2 cm in size,

OR if it just won't heal

YOUR ABSCESS MAY NEED TO BE CUT & DRAINED IN A STERILE ENVIRONMENT


TREAT EARLY TO AVOID COMPLICATIONS

SEEKING HELP AND EXPOSING AN INJECTION SITE CAN BE A VULNERABLE THING. BRING SOMEONE YOU TRUST

WHAT IS AN ABSCESS?

- An abscess is an infection under the skin
- Caused from a virus,
 bacteria, or parasite
 (from unsanitary water or cottons)





WHAT CAUSES AN ABSCESS?

- Sharing or reusing needles and supplies
- Missing your vein when injecting
- Using too much unsterile acidifier
- Not cleaning the site before injecting
- Skin popping & Muscle popping

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

- Hot to touch
- Redness
- Pus
- Fever
- Streaking
- Swelling
- Can show up anywhere on the body, but most likely at injection site

HOW TO PREVENT GETTING AN ABSCESS?

- Cleanse your hands with soap and water or sanitizer
- Cleanse the injection site with an alcohol swab
- Always use new supplies
- Avoid licking your needle



COMPLICATIONS OF AN ABSCESS

SEPSIS: A blood infection that is characterized by fever or chills, sweating, tiredness, racing heart, difficulty breathing

DRAW A CIRCLE

AROUND

YOUR ABSCESS TO

MONITOR ITS SIZE

DID YOU KNOW?

SKIN POPPING (INJECTING IN THE LAYER
BETWEEN YOUR SKIN & FAT) & MUSCLE POPPING
(PUTTING THE NEEDLE STRAIGHT DOWN & DEEP
INTO THE MUSCLE) PUTS YOU AT A GREAT RISK
FOR DEVELOPING AN ABSCESS

IF YOU MUST POP: MAKE SURE TO FILTER
YOUR DRUGS USING A STERI-FILT OR CLEAN
COTTON
